Melbourne Writers Festival brings writers and readers together to be inspired, challenged and thrilled by an excellent, creative and surprising program of events celebrating books and ideas.

Since 1986, we have entertained hundreds of thousands of readers as the flagship annual writers festival of our UNESCO City of Literature. MWF ignites conversations across Melbourne and inspires curiosity and connection.

In 2025, we welcomed **over 130 writers** and **21,000 audience members** to **70 events** across **four extraordinary days**.

What a magical 2025 Melbourne Writers Festival!

Melbourne's readers embraced this year's formally varied MWF program, which ranged from panels, talks and workshops to live podcasts, walking tours, afternoon tea events, intimate salons, multilingual

programming and events in translation, performance works and commissioned storytelling events.

We expanded to new venues across Melbourne's CBD, and introduced Pay What You Wish ticketing for many events, making MWF more financially accessible to existing and new audiences.

Audiences of all ages came together to celebrate books and writing in our City of Literature, with over **21,000 readers** joining us at MWF – representing a 36 per cent increase in attendance on last year's festival. We presented sold-out primary and secondary MWF Schools programs and a remarkable 41 sold-out events in the public program.

The 2025 Festival was filled with memorable moments. The breathtaking Opening Night readings and performances by Rumaan Alam, Samantha Harvey, Hannah Kent, Solli Raphael, and MWF's First Nations Guest Curators Daniel Browning and Nardi Simpson reflected on the festival theme of Magical Thinking, including a spellbinding musical performance with voice and possum-skin cloak by Nardi. Marian Keyes made hundreds of adoring readers laugh and cry (often simultaneously) at a special Mother's Day conversation about her extraordinary career. Philosopher A.C. Grayling's stirring closing address exposed the faultlines and possibilities of making peace in the culture wars.

There were also surprising moments of festival alchemy - like Booker Prize-shortlisted debut novelist Yael van der Wouden sharing her hilarious David Attenborough advice columnist impersonation, and Jimmy Barnes spontaneously breaking into Scottish folksongs during his interview with **Brian Nankervis**.

Every festival-goer will have their own personal moments that thrilled, surprised and moved them from chance encounters in the signing queue to revelatory flashes of inspiration and connection.








Readings, our Official Festival Bookseller, reported a 19 per cent increase in sales on last year. The following titles were the top ten bestsellers of the 2025 Festival.








