## Will Kostakis: Courage & Sexuality

Secondary School, Years 8-10

 'Over the past seventy days, I have asked teenagers what they would do if they had the power to change the world. The climate is a pressing concern, but not their only one. They want to better support the homeless. They want to end refugee detention. They want to stifle discrimination in all its forms.' – Will Kostakis

**Writing Prompt:** There is so much happening in the world right now. Look at the news. What is one thing you are worried about? What is one positive thing that is happening?

'The most popular joke of my teens was saying,
"Gay," when someone did something we didn't like
or understand. It was hilarious. Not allowed now.
Some might call it political correctness. Others
might wonder why it was ever funny in the first
place.' – Will Kostakis

Research & Discuss: The history of the word 'gay'.
